1 Samuel 1-3,7-8

1. Greet everyone at your table and share your name. What is your favorite 4<sup>th</sup> of July food?
2. Read 1 Samuel 1:1-9. What do you learn about Hannah?
3. How does Hannah deal with her difficult situation in 1 Samuel 1:10-11?  
What does she vow before the LORD as she pours her heart out to Him?  
What is God's response to Hannah's prayer in 1 Samuel 1:19-20?
4. Read 1 Samuel 1:21-28 and recount how Samuel's mother keeps her vow to the LORD.
5. 1 Samuel 2:1-11 is a prayer of praise lifted up by Samuel's mother. Where do you see evidence of God's sovereignty in her prayer? How would her words encourage Samuel as he begins a life dedicated to the LORD?
6. Read 1 Samuel 3:1-14. Describe Samuel's encounter with the LORD.  
  
In Samuel 3:19-22, what do the Israelites recognize about Samuel?
7. What challenge does Samuel lay before Israel concerning their loyalty to the LORD in 1 Samuel 7:3-5? How do they respond to his challenge?
8. Intercessory prayer for Israel was an important part of Samuel's ministry. How do Samuel's prayers make a difference in 1 Samuel 7:5-10?
9. In Samuel's last years, Israel demands a change of leadership. Discuss Israel's request and Samuel's reaction in 1 Samuel 8:5-9.  
  
List some of the negatives Israel will experience under a king according to Samuel in vv. 10-18.  
  
In vv. 19-22, the LORD responds to their appeal for an earthly king. Why do you think He agrees to their request?
10. Samuel faithfully served the LORD all his life as Israel's judge and prophet. What impresses you about Samuel's life story as Israel's final judge?

Consecrated Before Birth

1:1-2:11

- Samuel's barren mother prays for a child and vows to dedicate him to the LORD.
- Samuel's name, which means "God hears" reflects God's hand on his life.
- God uses Hannah's barrenness for His sovereign purpose.
- Praise for the sovereignty of God ushers Samuel into his lifelong ministry.

Called at a Young Age

2:12-3:21

- God rejects the priesthood of Eli and his sons because of their sin.
- Samuel thrives physically and spiritually as he ministers to the LORD.
- Samuel responds obediently when he recognizes the LORD's voice.
- His first act as a prophet is to reveal God's plan concerning Eli's sons.
- All of Israel accept Samuel as a prophet of the LORD as his words are proven true.

***Listen constantly for the LORD's \_\_\_\_\_.***

***Be \_\_\_\_\_ to reply "Speak, for your servant hears."***

Committed for Life

7:1-8:22

- Intercession for Israel before the LORD was a priority in Samuel's ministry.
- God answers Samuel's prayer by supernaturally defeating the Philistines.
- The memorial stone, called Ebenezer, commemorated God's triumph and Israel's trust in Him.
- Samuel is dismayed by Israel's insistence on a king to rule over them.
- After Samuel's warnings to Israel, God grants their repeated request for an earthly king.

***Follow God faithfully and \_\_\_\_\_ to His plans.***
