


1 SAMUEL 26-27

1. Recall a time when your circumstances tempted you to begin doubting God's faithfulness. Describe how doubt often leads to feeling disheartened.

What type of circumstances cause us to feel disheartened?

2. Read 1 Samuel 26:1-4. By this point, David has been running from Saul for several years. Where do we find David in verse 1 and why is he there?

According to verses 2-4, how does Saul respond to the report of David's whereabouts?

What does Saul know to be true about David that is revealed in this response? Look at 1 Samuel 16:18 for insight.

3. Read again 1 Samuel 26:4. Consider the spies that David sent out when he learned Saul was in the wilderness. What might have been some of the helpful information the spies reported to David?

How do you think David felt upon hearing Saul was coming for him?

4. Read 1 Samuel 24:1-6 along with 1 Samuel 26:5-12 and record the similarities and differences.

5. David is given a second chance to kill Saul. In 1 Samuel 26:9-11, what are the reasons he gives for again sparing Saul's life?

6. 1 Samuel 26:12 records the Lord caused a deep sleep to fall on Saul and his entire army. Although not recorded, what are some possible reasons for God giving David another opportunity to kill Saul?

7. Continue by reading 1 Samuel 26:13-25. How does David defend himself before Saul in verse 18?

Saul had been pursuing David for over five years. What emotions do you think David would be feeling as he pleads his case before Saul?

David is still confused over Saul's relentless pursuit of him. What is David trying to understand in verse 19?

Saul confesses his wrongdoing and promises to never again harm David. David then sends his servant to return Saul's spear. What does this action reveal about David's confidence in Saul's promise?

8. The last recorded words spoken between David and Saul are recorded in 1 Samuel 26:24-25. How do David's words in verse 24 differ from Saul's words recorded in verse 25?

What does this reveal about David?

What does it reveal about Saul?

9. Read 1 Samuel 27:1-4. What words describe David's state of mind in verse 1?

What decision does David make in verses 1-4 and why?

10. Continue by reading 1 Samuel 27:5-7. Upon arriving at Gath, a Philistine city, what did David request of Achish, king of Gath? What did Achish do in response?

Why might Achish be so quick to grant this request to David, Saul's mortal enemy?

11. Read 1 Samuel 27:8-12. Describe what David did while living in Ziklag.

According to verse 12, what did David's action lead Achish to believe?

12. Count the number of times the word God or Lord is used in chapter 26. How many times do you see the word God or Lord in chapter 27? What conclusion can you draw from this comparison?

How could this have led to David's actions in chapter 27?

13. Recall a time when you were under great distress for a prolonged period of time. How were you tempted to act on plans not approved by God?

What lessons can we learn from David in 1 Samuel 26-27 to prevent making questionable decisions when we are struggling with doubt and self-pity?

14. Write out a personal prayer request in one or two sentences to share with your small group.
