2. Read Mark 1:29-31 and Luke 4:38-39. Peter is a close disciple of Jesus. Describe what is going on in Peter's home when Jesus arrives.

Describe how the people in the home might be feeling in this situation.

3. Read Matthew 8:14-17. What does Jesus do when he arrives at Peter's home?
What is the impact of Jesus' actions on the different people in the home?
4. Reread Matthew 8:17. Then read Isaiah 53:4-5. Describe what you learn about Jesus in these verses.
How have these truths about Jesus influenced you or how can they affect you moving forward?
5. Read Mark 5:21-24. What do you learn about Jairus and his family?
6. While on the way to Jairus' home, Jesus stops and heals an ill woman which delays his arrival at Jairus' home. Read Mark 5:35-40. Contrast the perspective of the people from Jairus' home with that of Jesus.

7. Read Mark 5:39-43 along with Matthew 9:35-36. What do you learn about Jesus?
How have you personally experienced the compassion of Jesus -- in small or large ways?
8. Reread Mark 5:42 again. How did Jesus' actions impact the physical and emotional condition of the different people in Jairus' home?

9. What are steps we can take to invite Jesus into the broken parts of our own lives?

As we are surrounded by friends and family members experiencing brokenness, how can we love them well?

EPHESIANS 1:19b-22 [A]ccording to the working of his great might that he worked in Christ when he raised him from the dead and seated him at his right hand in the heavenly places, far above all rule and authority and power and dominion, and above every name that is named, not only in this age but also in the one to come. And he put all things under his feet and gave him as head over all things to the church.

COLOSSIANS 2:9-10 For in him the whole fullness of deity dwells bodily, and you have been filled in him, who is the head of all rule and authority.

MATTHEW 9:35-36 And Jesus went throughout all the cities and villages, teaching in their synagogues and proclaiming the gospel of the kingdom and healing every disease and every affliction. When he saw the crowds, he had compassion for them, because they were harassed and helpless, like sheep without a shepherd.

ISAIAH 53:4-5 Surely he has borne our griefs and carried our sorrows; yet we esteemed him stricken, smitten by God, and afflicted. But he was pierced for our transgressions; he was crushed for our iniquities; upon him was the chastisement that brought us peace, and with his wounds we are healed.

REVELATION 21:3-4 And I heard a loud voice from the throne saying, "Behold, the dwelling place of God is with man. He will dwell with them, and they will be his people, and God himself will be with them as their God. He will wipe away every tear from their eyes, and death shall be no more, neither shall there be mourning, nor crying, nor pain anymore, for the former things have passed away."
