lohn introduced Jesus as the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world. n one remarkable sentence, John summarized the redemptive program revealed in God's Word.		
The Old Testament question is "Where is the lamb?" The New Testament answer is "Behold, the Lamb of God."		
As our Lamb, Jesus bore the punishment God's justice demands.		
Seeing the Spirit descend on Jesus, John could testify to the deity of Jesus Christ.

MATTHEW 11:9, 13-14 "What then did you go out to see? A prophet? Yes, I tell you, and more than a prophet...For all the Prophets and the Law prophesied until John, and if you are willing to accept it, he is Elijah who is to come."
