## JOURNAL Matthew 2:13-18

One commentary offers this insight into this passage in Matthew:

Centuries earlier, Nebuchadnezzar's army had gathered the captives from Judah in the town of Ramah before they were taken into exile to Babylon (Jer 40:1-2). Jeremiah depicts Rachel, who is the personification of the mothers of Israel, mourning for her children as they are being carried away. She has no comfort as they are removed from the land, because they are "no more"—that is, no longer a nation and considered as dead. But even as Jeremiah pictures this dreadful mourning for exiled Israel, he offers from God a word of comfort: There is hope for their future because God will restore Rachel's children to their own land (Jer 31:16-17), and messianic joy will come in the future establishment of the new covenant with Israel (Jer 31:31-34). —The NIV Application Commentary, Matthew

Read Jeremiah 31:1-17. What do these incidents of anguish and mourning teach us about what was to come through Jesus? How does it give you hope that your own future is one of comfort, even in the midst of difficulty in this world?
