



1. What new insights did you gain from this sermon?

FOR THIS WEEK

SCRIPTURE MEMORY VERSE: MATTHEW 4:19 And he said to them, "Follow me, and I will make you fishers of men."

> JOURNAL: Matthew 4:12-25

"Not every disciple of Jesus is called to leave behind his or her profession. Whatever our profession, discipleship means that we place as the priority of our lives joining with Jesus in reaching our daily world with the good news of life in the kingdom of heaven. I cannot reach non-Christian police officers as efficiently as committed Christian police officers. No pastor can enter into the complex world of corporate finance as effectively as a committed and knowledgeable Christian businessperson. We each have a privileged place of ministry that is unique to following Jesus in our own daily lives. ... Although they 'left everything,' Peter continues to live in his own home with his wife and mother-in-law, and likely so does his brother Andrew and his family (8:14-15). There is a sense in which Peter and the rest of the Twelve give up everything to play their foundational role in the church, yet we never hear of them abandoning their responsibilities to provide for their families. The apostle Paul will later rebuke believers who were ministerial busybodies and did not care for the needs of their family (2 Thes 3:6-13; 1 Tim 5:8)."

2. Read Matthew 4:12-25. This is not the first encounter between these men and Jesus. Read John 1:35-42, 2:1-11. What perspective does this passage provide on their response when Jesus later called them in the Matthew passage?

3. As the disciples understood more about the nature of Jesus' ministry and who He was, their commitment to Him also had to be adjusted along the way. How has your understanding of Jesus caused a corresponding adjustment of your own commitment to Him? How has your gradual learning of who He is helped your faith to grow?

4. How would you describe the reaction of the crowds thus far in Jesus' ministry? How does their initial enthusiasm reveal their focus on having their own needs met, rather than on who Jesus was?

5. The darkness of our own world is real even when we, or those around us, don't notice it. To be away from Jesus is to be in the darkness of the world. In what ways have you noticed yourself subtly drifting away from Jesus, and what must you do to stay in His light?

JOURNAL Matthew 4:12-25

As we've seen in previous passages, preparations for Jesus' ministry are complete (miraculous birth, prophecy fulfilled, anointed for ministry, confirmed by the Father, authority over Satan). This passage is now a turning point in Matthew's narrative. John's ministry has ended with his arrest, so Jesus begins preaching His message of God breaking into history. Now people are forced to make a decision: They either adjust their expectations to accept God's agenda and are with Him, or they are against Him.

In what ways have you had to adjust your expectations of the Christian life? With what aspects of God's Kingdom agenda do you still struggle today? How will you take your struggles to the Father as you follow Jesus?
