1. Read Matthew 5:21-26. What thoughts from this sermon were new or particularly helpful to you?

"It may be that we have never struck another person, but can we say that we never wished to strike someone? It may be that we have never committed adultery, but can we say that we have never experienced the desire for the forbidden thing? It was Jesus' teaching that thoughts are just as important as deeds, and that it is not enough not to commit a sin; the only thing that is enough is not to wish to commit it. It was Jesus' teaching that we are not judged only by our deeds, but are judged even more by the desires which never emerged in deeds. By the world's standards, people are considered good if they never do a forbidden thing. The world is not concerned to judge people's thoughts. By Jesus' standards, we can only aspire to goodness when we never even desire to do a forbidden thing. Jesus is intensely concerned with our thoughts."

2. On what external causes do we tend to blame our sin? How do those things make sinning easier? Yet how is the decision to sin an act of our own will?

3. Chances are good that no one in the crowd Jesus spoke to was ever tried for murder, so they probably felt fairly righteous about that particular sin. But then what surprising revelation does Jesus give about their outward religiosity with the phrase "but I say to you" (v. 22)?

4. As long as there is unresolved internal sin, outward acts of worship are not acceptable to God. How does this fact shape your own preparation for worship each week? Have you ever had to "leave your gift at the altar" so your worship of God was not impeded?

5. What point from this sermon led you to a conviction to take action? What will that action be? How can you rely on the Holy Spirit and other believers to help you?

### JOURNAL Matthew 5:21-26

In the Sermon on the Mount, Jesus struck at the the man-made veneer of the religious authorities by shifting the emphasis from merely external, observable conformity to internal transformation.

Why is it more difficult to obey Jesus' teaching on transforming the heart than obeying the Ten Commandments (Ex 20:1-17)?

What does it look like for you to focus on heart transformation instead of outward conformity?
