> JOURNAL: Matthew 10:26-42

"Loyal disciples willingly accept rejection, even from their own families. When we openly acknowledge our identity as Christ followers through words and actions, we shouldn't be surprised when social conflict ensues. When Christ returns and sets everything right, peace will reign across the globe. All nations will acknowledge the kingship of Jesus. But until then, our expressed commitment to Christ will not result in increasing peace and harmony. Instead, it will bring division, disharmony, misunder-standing, and the harshest kinds of rejection and persecution. ... Christians shouldn't deliberately seek conflict with family members. In fact, Paul says, 'If possible, so far as it depends on you, be at peace with all men' (Rom. 12:18). But even those words suggest that it won't always be possible. We must willingly accept conflict with friends and family if it occurs."

2. Read Matthew 10:26-42. Because Jesus refused to disguise or minimize the cost of discipleship, many would-be disciples left Him. What radical requirements did Jesus make of those who would follow Him?

3. What promises did Jesus make to those who fully obeyed Him?
