DEVOTIONAL & HOME GROUP STUDY

- 1. Read 1 Corinthians 1:1-9. How does the reader know that Paul has the authority to speak about his subject? By whose authority does he write? Why are these things important?
- 2. Corinth was a particularly sin-polluted city (see Rom 1:18–32 for what Paul wrote from Corinth as he saw the sins he listed). Though saved by Christ, this church was worldly and rife with division. Christians were not acting like Christians. Why, then, did Paul refer to them in verse 2 as *saints*? Why would he remind them of this fact before confronting their sin in the rest of the letter?
- 3. Paul reminds the Corinthian Christians that they are saints *who still sin*. How should this help us view one another in our pews, in our Home Group, or in all our relationships? How should our position as saints affect our behavior as we live together in the Church?
- 4. What is *grace*? (See Jn 1:14; Rom 3:24; Eph 1:6, 2:8; 3:7; Heb 4:16; Ti 2:11-14, 2 Thes 2:16.) How is grace the foundation for unity? How does it bring thanksgiving?
- 5. On the sermon notes, whom did you list as one person who supports you and one person who sharpens you? How do *supporting* and *sharpening* differ, and why is each important for your growth in Christ? Have you thanked God for both people?

- "It is something to be thankful for God's goodness to yourself, but it is a higher virtue to be thankful for God's goodness to others. How grateful we might be all day long if we had a quick eye to see the grace of God in our fellow-Christians, and if we blessed God for it whenever we saw it! There are some whose eye is much more quick to see imperfections than to see graces."
- "What greater motivation for becoming a Christian could an unbeliever have, and what greater consolation could a believer have, than to know that in Christ all sins—past, present, and future—are forgiven forever? In Christ all guilt and all penalty are permanently removed. In Him we will stand totally guiltless and holy for the rest of eternity. When God saves, He ultimately takes away all sin, all guilt, all punishment. That is grace."

6. In light of your standing as a saint, and even in adverse circumstances like the ones we now face on a daily basis, think about how you can actively be thankful for ...

- every good and perfect gift (Jas 1:17; Eph 1:3-14; Gal 5:22-23);
- the fact that God loves you enough not to leave you the same—or leave you at all.

EXERCISE FOR THIS WEEK

On one day this week: Write out your thanksgiving to God for every good and perfect gift.

On one other day this week: Write your thanksgiving to God for the fact that He loves you enough not to leave you the same, or ever leave you at all.

Use additional paper, if needed, or write these in your journal.
