EXERCISE FOR THIS WEEK

Begin Praying With Your Spouse

1. Consider how the enemy of our souls doesn't want us praying together.

Anything that strengthens your bond and causes you to come together in like-mindedness will be considered dangerous to Satan and he'll do whatever it takes to prevent it—through distraction, misunderstanding, interruptions, feelings of intimidation, personal fatigue, etc.

- **2. Talk to God first about your desire to pray with your spouse.** Ask Him for time in your schedule, for wisdom in suggesting it, and that He will prepare the heart of your spouse to desire this time with you.
- **3. Set a time.** Get creative with scheduling time to pray. There will be times you or your spouse will need to postpone or reschedule. Be flexible and extend grace.
- **4. Ease into it.** There's a reason prayer is considered a spiritual discipline—it will take work. Start with praying together once a week, then gradually increase until it becomes a part of your schedule.
- **5. Keep it short and simple.** Limit your prayer time to the basic or most pressing needs on your heart.
- **6. Keep it safe and supported.** Be open about how praying aloud together can be intimidating. Agree that anything prayed for won't be analyzed, critiqued or shared with others.
