- 2. Read John 15:1-11. Before verse 11, Jesus mentions the word joy once, but afterward He uses it seven times. Paul writes, Jesus, the founder and perfecter of our faith, who for the joy that was set before him endured the cross ... (Heb 12:2). What was the joy that awaited Jesus after He endured the cross, and what does it reveal about our Savior?
- 3. We often think of ourselves as a "little vine" instead of a branch of the True Vine. How does this mindset take away our joy? What does Jesus tell us to do instead?

Journaling in John 15:1-11

Last week's Scripture memorized JOHN 14:16 "And I will ask the Father, and he will give you another Helper, to be with you forever ..." 4. Author J. C. Ryle writes, "Never, hardly, do we find an eminent saint, either in the Old Testament or the New, who was not purified by suffering, and, like His Master, a 'man of sorrows.' Let us learn to be patient in the days of darkness, if we know anything of vital union with Christ. Let us remember the doctrine of the passage before us, and not murmur and complain because of trials. Our trials are not meant to do us harm, but good. God chastens us 'for our profit, that we may be partakers of His holiness' (Heb 12:10)." How is God teaching you patience in trials, and how has this passage of John encouraged you as you persevere?

5. Would you say that you welcome the Lord's pruning in your life? Why or why not? How does one welcome or allow pruning? How does obedience to the Lord play a part?
