- A. Immanuel was born of a virgin, conceived by the Holy Spirit.
- B. Immanuel came as a baby, humble and approachable.

II. Joseph gave His Son the name —the one who saves us.

"She will bear a son, and you shall call his name Jesus, for he will save his people from their sins." ... but knew her not until she had given birth to a son. And he called his name Jesus. vv. 21, 25

- A. Jesus took on flesh to relate to our everyday lives.
- B. Jesus took on flesh to live the sinless life we could never live.

Journaling in Matthew 1:18-25

3. Matthew's account of the birth of Jesus is from Joseph's point of view. Imagine the agony of decision Joseph faced once Mary was with child (see Deut. 22:23-24). What options would he have been considering? How would he have had to adjust his life to obey what the angel told him?

- 4. What was the personal cost to Mary for her obedience to the Lord? How do the actions of this couple demonstrate God's wisdom in choosing them?
- 5. Does the miracle of Jesus' conception seem implausible? Matthew Henry wrote:

The mystery of Christ's incarnation is to be adored, not pried into. If we know not the way of the Spirit in the formation of common persons, nor how the bones are formed in the womb of any one that is with child (Eccl 11:5), much less do we know how the blessed Jesus was formed in the womb of the blessed virgin.

His miraculous birth can seem implausible when heard in isolation. But in the context of the rest of Jesus' life, the entire history of israel and the changed lives of countless people, how does this miracle seem not only plausible, but *probable*? Why is this context important?

JOURNAL Matthew 1:18-25

We all identify as something—family member, group member, job title. But when we came to know Jesus, we were given a new name—*Christ Follower* or *Little Christ* (see 1 John 3:1). God tells us who we're called to be, and that person has an unshakeable identity, destiny and purpose.

Jesus came with an identity, and He came for *you*. What does this mean for you personally? How have you been living as if your earthly identity is more important than your identity in Christ? What changes can you make to focus more on the identity Christ gave you?
