## II. TAX:

## discloses ownership and submission.

... saying, "Teacher, we know that you are true and teach the way of God truthfully, and you do not care about anyone's opinion, for you are not swayed by appearances. Tell us, then, what you think. Is it lawful to pay taxes to Caesar, or not?" But Jesus, aware of their malice, said, "Why put me to the test, you hypocrites? Show me the coin for the tax." And they brought him a denarius. And Jesus said to them, "Whose likeness and inscription is this?" They said, "Caesar's." Then he said to them, "Therefore render to Caesar the things that are Caesar's, and to God the things that are God's." When they heard it, they marveled. And they left him and went away. vv. 16b-22

To take a simple example, few are wealthy enough to have a lighting system or a cleansing system or a water system of their own. These are public services.... Because Christians are men and women of honor, they must be responsible citizens; failure in good citizenship is also failure in Christian duty."
