MATTHEW 26:36-46



I. Jesus modeled for us how to endure the most difficult and distressing moments in our lives.

A. The Savior experienced this place of anguish and the “press” of life because of ...

rejection - by His own people and tribe

betrayal - by a close follower and disciple

loneliness - totally abandoned by His disciples

loss - grieving the broken family He loved so much

fear - impending death as a common criminal

pain - foreseeing agonizing physical torture and abuse

despair - overwhelming dread of separation from the Father

B. Our Lord was “pressed” so hard, from his brow flowed drops of sweat and blood. (Lk 22:43-44)

HOW TO PRAY WHEN YOU NEED IT MOST

1. Never go into the place of suffering _____—ask those who love you to pray for you. (vv. 36-37, 40-41)
2. Find a special _____ to humble yourself and be alone with God. (v. 39a; Lk 22:41)
3. Tell the Father your heartfelt _____ and desires. (v. 39b)
4. Always remember to pray “Thy _____ be done.” (v. 39c)
5. Pray frequently to get your will _____ with God’s will. (vv. 42, 44)
6. Don’t stop praying until you can face the matter with faith and trust in God’s _____. (v. 45)



Jesus knows and understands what I’m feeling in the dark nights of life, and He loves me.

Gethsemane is the place where you and I make a decision to say “God, empty me of myself and let me depend on you!”

"Watch and pray that you may not enter into temptation. The spirit indeed is willing, but the flesh is weak."

JOURNAL:

Matthew 26:36-46

"No sinful human being can understand the conflict in the soul of Jesus who had never experienced the slightest shadow of sin and had never known any barrier between Himself and the Father. Now upon this holy One had come the hour when He would bear all the terrible sin of the world—past, present, and future—and would experience being the sin offering forsaken by the Father. The human desire to avoid such agony is not incompatible with the immutability of the divine nature. This presents no theological problem to anyone accepting the full humanity as well as the full deity of Christ. It is clear that whatever the desire of the human nature may have been, Jesus was unwavering in doing the will of His Father: 'Nevertheless, not as I will, but as you will.'"

5. In what area of your life do you need to say to the Lord, "Your will be done"?
