1. The early church came to be in a pagan society that didn't value life. In fact, the Roman Empire didn't legislate abortion until the 3rd century, through the influence of Christians. What other historical thoughts from the sermon were valuable to you in regard to ForLife issues?

"We know the principle of justice that when two legitimate rights conflict, the right that protects the higher value should prevail. We deny the right to drive at 100 miles per hour because the value of life is greater than the value of being on time or getting thrills. The right of the unborn not to be killed and the right of a woman not to be pregnant may be at odds. But they are not equal rights. Staying alive is more precious and more basic than not being pregnant."

"The present toleration of abortion is deeply rooted in this new kind of individualism and personal rights movement. The pro-abortion people always argue that a woman has a right to control her own body and therefore she has the right to abort any intrusion into that body. Yet society recognizes rights must be limited when they conflict with another person's rights. And certainly the person in the womb of the mother has rights."
