HOW TO START A RELATIONSHIP WITH JESUS

Admit that you're a sinner, separated from a holy and perfect God. (*Romans 3:23; Isaiah 53:6*)

Understand that the penalty for your sin is death—eternal separation from God and all that is good. (*Romans 6:23; Hebrews 9:27*)

Believe that Jesus Christ took the penalty for your sin by dying in your place and conquered death by rising from the dead. (*Romans 5:8; 2 Corinthians 5:21*)

Receive the free gift of salvation by trusting in Christ alone as your Savior from sin and death, and as your provider of true and eternal life. (*Romans 4:4-5, 5:1; Ephesians 2:8-9*)

You can use this prayer: "Dear God, I know that I am a sinner. I believe that Jesus Christ died on the cross for me and rose from the dead. I trust in Him alone as the only way to get right with You. Thank You for the forgiveness of sins and eternal life I now have. Amen."
