Persistence Amidst Resistance

ACTS 4:1-22

I. **RESISTANCE COMES** because Christ threatens a person's previous

And as they were speaking to the people, the priests and the captain of the temple and the Sadducees came upon them, greatly annoyed because they were teaching the people and proclaiming in Jesus the resurrection from the dead. And they arrested them and put them in custody until the next day, for it was already evening. vv. 1-3

Persist in ______ where you are, regardless of what doors seemed to be closed. But many of those who had heard the word believed, and the number of the men came to about five thousand. v. 4

II. **RESISTANCE COMES** because Christ threatens a person's social

On the next day their rulers and elders and scribes gathered together in Jerusalem, with Annas the high priest and Caiaphas and John and Alexander, and all who were of the high-priestly family. And when they had set them in the midst, they inquired, "By what power or by what name did you do this?" vv. 5-7

_____ on the Holy Spirit's work in you, through you, and to others.

Then Peter, filled with the Holy Spirit, said to them, "Rulers of the people and elders, if we are being examined today concerning a good deed done to a crippled man, by what means this man has been healed, let it be known to all of you and to all the people of Israel that by the name of Jesus Christ of Nazareth, whom you crucified, whom God raised from the dead—by him this man is standing before you well." vv. 8-10

III. RESISTANCE COMES because Christ threatens a person's future

But when they had commanded them to leave the council, they conferred with one another, saying, "What shall we do with these men? For that a notable sign has been performed through them is evident to all the inhabitants of Jerusalem, and we cannot deny it. But in order that it may spread no further among the people, let us warn them to speak no more to anyone in this name." vv. 15-17

Persist in

time with Jesus so you can continually speak about Him.

So they called them and charaed them not to speak or teach at all in the name of Jesus. But Peter and John answered them, "Whether it is right in the sight of God to listen to you rather than to God, you must judge, for we cannot but speak of what we have seen and heard." vv. 18-20

Persist amidst resistance, _____ God can miraculously intervene.

"This Jesus is the stone that was rejected by you, the builders, which has become the cornerstone. And there is salvation in no one else, for there is no other name under heaven given among men by which we must be saved." Now when they saw the boldness of Peter and John, and perceived that they were uneducated, common men, they were astonished. And they recognized that they had been with Jesus. But seeing the man who was healed standing beside them, they had nothing to say in opposition. vv. 11-14



Ask the Holy Spirit to reveal His truth and wisdom as you go through this lesson.

1. When have you been completely shut down by someone who resisted hearing about Jesus? Did affect the way you shared Jesus with others going forward?

2. Read Acts 4:1-22. What is the one fact about this event involving the disciples and the paralytic that no one could dispute? How did the religious leaders try to dodge that fact?

3. How does the indisputable fact of the change Jesus made in your own life encourage you as you prepare to make a defense to anyone who asks you for a reason for the hope that is in you (1 Pet 3:15)?

4. What would the religious leaders stand to lose if they bowed the knee to Jesus? What would others in the crowd perceive they would lose? What have you lost, and gained, in becoming His disciple?

5. Can you share about someone God pursued for a long time, but they resisted, then they finally came to know Christ? What did you learn from that situation, and how can those things encourage others in your group?

6. Is there someone you've given up on talking about Jesus with because they've repeatedly resisted? How can you pray for them as you wait and watch to see what God will do in their life?

A WONDERFUL OFFER

Being a Christian isn't based on membership in a local church or keeping a set of rules. It involves a personal relationship with Jesus Christ and an understanding of who He is and what He has done to provide man with a way to experience God's love for us. Here's how to know Jesus Christ as your personal Savior:

1. Realize that you are sinful and separated from God. (Romans 3:23; Isaiah 53:6)

2. Recognize that the penalty for your sin is death—eternal separation from God and all that is good. (Romans 6:23; Hebrews 9:27)

3. Understand that Jesus Christ took the penalty for your sin by dying in your place and that He rose again. (Romans 5:8; 2 Corinthians 5:21)

4. Receive the free gift of salvation by trusting in Christ alone as your Savior. (Romans 4:4-5; Ephesians 2:8-9) "For God so loved the world, that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish, but have eternal life." (John 3:16 NASB) You can use this prayer to express your decision to God:

"Dear God, I know that I am a sinner. I believe that Jesus Christ died on the cross for me and rose from the dead. I trust in Him alone as the only way to get right with You. Thank You for the forgiveness of sins and the eternal life I now have. Amen."
