Lessons From a Church Service Gone Bad

ACTS 5:1-11

2 reasons why God responded so severely:

A _____ reason (with God)

Ananias and Sapphira had felt the prompting of the Holy Spirit but became convinced by the enemy that they could scam God. (vv. 3, 8)

God made an example of this couple because they perpetrated sin during a key revelatory period in redemptive history. (v. 11)

A _____ reason (with believers)

This couple was virtue signaling and exemplifying to the early church an attitude that dishonored Jesus. (vv. 9-10)

God wanted to press on all generations of believers our responsibility to reflect truth and godly virtues to a lost world. (v. 4)

AUTHENTIC CHRISTIAN COMMUNITY IS SHAPED BY VIRTUES THE WORLD CANNOT GRASP.

The virtues of a changed life are:

_____, not pride (Jas 4:6; Prov 8:13)

When we're more concerned about our reputation than our character, there's no limit to what we will do.

_____, not greed (Jas 1:5; 1 Thes 2:5)

When the Holy Spirit reminds us of the generosity of Jesus, it should always open wide our hearts and pocketbooks.

_____, not hypocrisy (Jas 3:17; 1 Pet 2:1)

When we make truth, transparency and authenticity our highest priority, it attracts the world to Jesus.



2. Read Acts 5:1-11. How did the transaction of Ananias and Sapphira compare with the one Barnabas made in 4:36-37? Note as many details as you can.

3. How surprising to you is the idea that God cares about our motives? How do we truthfully examine our motives for doing anything in life?

5. Have you ever had an area of sin you thought God would overlook? How has He dealt with your sin previously, and what does He say in His Word say He will do about it going forward?

6. How can you search out any areas of hypocrisy in your life? How can you more purposefully strive to be honest with God and with other Christians?

**Conspicuously displaying one's attentiveness to political issues (matters of social and racial justice, etc.), especially instead of taking effective action*

A WONDERFUL OFFER

Being a Christian isn't based on membership in a local church or keeping a set of rules. It involves a personal relationship with Jesus Christ and an understanding of who He is and what He has done to provide man with a way to experience God's love for us. Here's how to know Jesus Christ as your personal Savior:

1. Realize that you are sinful and separated from God. (Romans 3:23; Isaiah 53:6)
 2. Recognize that the penalty for your sin is death—eternal separation from God and all that is good. (Romans 6:23; Hebrews 9:27)
 3. Understand that Jesus Christ took the penalty for your sin by dying in your place and that He rose again. (Romans 5:8; 2 Corinthians 5:21)
 4. Receive the free gift of salvation by trusting in Christ alone as your Savior. (Romans 4:4-5; Ephesians 2:8-9)
- "For God so loved the world, that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish, but have eternal life." (John 3:16 NASB) You can use this prayer to express your decision to God:
"Dear God, I know that I am a sinner. I believe that Jesus Christ died on the cross for me and rose from the dead. I trust in Him alone as the only way to get right with You. Thank You for the forgiveness of sins and the eternal life I now have. Amen."
