He had come to Jerusalem to worship and was returning, seated in his chariot, and he was reading the prophet Isaiah. And the Spirit said to Philip, "Go over and join this chariot." So Philip ran to him and heard him reading Isaiah the prophet and asked, "Do you understand what you are reading?" And he said, "How can I, unless someone guides me?" And he invited Philip to come up and sit with him Then Philip opened his mouth, and beginning with this Scripture he told him the good news about Jesus. vv. 27b-31, 35

SERMON DEVOTIONAL STUDY

Ask the Holy Spirit to reveal His truth and wisdom as you go through this lesson.

- 1. Read Acts 8:26-40. What would it have been like for Philip to leave a place where so many exciting things were happening to go down a lonely desert road?
- 2. What do you think Phillip told the eunuch that made him want to be baptized? (Refer to earlier speeches in Acts, or Isaiah 52:13-53:12.)

"THE SPIRIT'S WORK OF preparation was complete. Philip had obeyed the Spirit's call and was in place to meet the man. The eunuch's heart was seeking, prepared by reading the Scriptures. Despite his power and prestige, he had a vast emptiness in his soul. He made a long, arduous journey from his homeland to Jerusalem, searching for the true God. Unfortunately, given the state of contemporary Judaism, he probably went away still empty. ... The eunuch was sitting in his chariot, and was reading the prophet Isaiah. He had a desire to know God and was aware that He was to be known through the Scripture. He was indeed an eager seeker. He had no doubt paid a great price in Jerusalem for that scroll, which would have been difficult for a Gentile to acquire, Perhaps Isaiah had special meaning to him, since the book speaks encouragingly to eunuchs (Is 56:3-5), ... That God rewards the seeking heart is the clear teaching of Scripture (Jer 29:13). The eunuch lived up to the light he had. God then gave him the full revelation of Jesus Christ through Philip's ministry."

- 3. Why do you think Luke doesn't tell us whether Philip laid hands on the eunuch, whether he received the Spirit, what amount of water was nearby, or whether he was immersed or had water poured over him?
- 4. How has your view of God's work in the world grown as you studied this passage?
- 5. What have you learned from this passage and sermon that might help you become a more effective witness?
- 6. What opportunities have you had to share the gospel this week? Has anything kept you from seizing all the chances you've had?

Being a Christian isn't based on membership in a local church or keeping a set of rules. - 1. Realize that you are sinful and separated from God. (Romans 3:23; Isaiah 53:6)
- 2. Recognize that the penalty for your sin is death—eternal separation from God and all that is good. (Romans 6:23; Hebrews 9:27)
- 3. Understand that Jesus Christ took the penalty for your sin by dying in your place and that He rose again. (Romans 5:8; 2 Corinthians 5:21)
- 4. Receive the free gift of salvation by trusting in Christ alone as your Savior. (Romans 4:4-5; Ephesians 2:8-9) "For God so loved the world, that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish, but have eternal life." (John 3:16 NASB) You can use this prayer to express your decision to God: "Dear God, I know that I am a sinner. I believe that Jesus Christ died on the cross for me and rose from the dead. I trust in Him alone as the only way to get right with You. Thank You for the forgiveness of sins and the eternal life I now have. Amen."
