II.	Now there was in Joppa a disciple named Tabitha, which, translated, means Dorcas. She was full of good works and acts of charity. In those days she became ill and died, and when they had washed her, they laid her in an upper room. Since Lydda was near Joppa, the disciples, hearing that Peter was there, sent two men to him, urging him, "Please come to us without delay." So Peter rose and went with them. And when he arrived, they took him to the upper room. All the widows stood beside him weeping and showing tunics and other garments that Dorcas made while she was with them. But Peter put them all outside, and knelt down and prayed; and turning to the body he said, "Tabitha, arise." And she opened her eyes, and when she saw Peter she sat up. And he gave her his hand and raised her up. Then, calling the saints and widows, he presented her alive. And it became known throughout all Joppa, and many believed in the Lord. vv. 36-42

SERMON DEVOTIONAL STUDY

Ask the Holy Spirit to reveal His truth and wisdom as you go through this lesson.

- 1. Read Acts 9:32-43. In what ways does this passage show that Peter was carrying out the command Jesus gave him to "feed my sheep" (John 21:15-19)?
- 2. How was Peter making sure that the credit for these miracles went to Jesus, and that Jesus was the hero of the story, not Peter?

occurs every day as people put their faith in Christ and are brought from death to life. However, the kinds of miracles, signs and wonders evident in the early church do not occur. In first century Christianity, their purpose was to reveal God's will and establish the foundation of the church. God can do whatever He chooses and if He decides to do a miracle today, His will be done. However, the Bible is now complete and readily accessiblesomething first century believers did not have. They preached the Word verbally, and signs and wonders followed as confirmation. Disciples of Christ must instead commit to study His Word where God will reveal truth, as opposed to looking for signs and wonders to convert the lost."

- 3. Why is it significant that Peter stayed in the home of a tanner? What does this tell you about the character of God and His agenda?
- 4. God often uses what seem at first to be incidental occurrences to open up great ministries. How has Luke illustrated this divine method here as he wrote Acts?
- 5. How has God been moving you out of your comfort zone? What encouragement did this sermon provide for you in that regard?
- 6. Who in your own life do you know to be sidelined, desperate or avoided? How has this sermon helped you be ready to minister individually to them?

Being a Christian isn't based on membership in a local church or keeping a set of rules. It involves a personal relationship with Jesus Christ and an understanding of who He is and what He has done to provide man with a way to experience God's love for us. - 1. Realize that you are sinful and separated from God. (Romans 3:23; Isaiah 53:6)
- 2. Recognize that the penalty for your sin is death—eternal separation from God and all that is good. (Romans 6:23; Hebrews 9:27)
- 3. Understand that Jesus Christ took the penalty for your sin by dying in your place and that He rose again. (Romans 5:8; 2 Corinthians 5:21)
- 4. Receive the free gift of salvation by trusting in Christ alone as your Savior. (Romans 4:4-5; Ephesians 2:8-9) "For God so loved the world, that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish, but have eternal life." (John 3:16 NASB) You can use this prayer to express your decision to God: "Dear God, I know that I am a sinner. I believe that Jesus Christ died on the cross for me and rose from the dead. I trust in Him alone as the only way to get right with You. Thank You for the forgiveness of sins and the eternal life I now have. Amen."
