



ACTS 10:1-48

God's reach extends beyond our expectations

I. defies cultural expectations. (vv. 1-8)

At Caesarea there was a man named Cornelius, a centurion of what was known as the Italian Cohort, a devout man who feared God with all his household, gave alms generously to the people, and prayed continually to God. vv. 1-2

A. He is not the type of person we expect to be interested in things of God.

- B. He is not a stereotypical Roman soldier.
- C. He receives a visit from an angel.

II. _____ defies Peter's expectations. (vv. 9-23)

And there came a voice to him: "Rise, Peter; kill and eat." But Peter said, "By no means, Lord; for I have never eaten anything that is common or unclean." And the voice came to him again a second time, "What God has made clean, do not call common." This happened three times, and the thing was taken up at once to heaven. vv. 13-16

A. God gives Peter three unexpected commands.

INVITATION: Rise, kill, and eat.

CORRECTION: What God has made clean, do not call common.

MISSION: Rise and go down and accompany them without hesitation.

III. _____ defies Jewish expectations. (vv. 24-48)

And he said to them, "You yourselves know how unlawful it is for a Jew to associate with or to visit anyone of another nation, but God has shown me that I should not call any person common or unclean." ... So Peter opened his mouth and said: "Truly I understand that God shows no partiality ..." vv. 28, 34

- A. Peter breaks Jewish law. (v. 28)
- B. Peter shows no partiality with the gospel. (v. 34)
- C. Peter baptizes Gentiles. (v. 47)

SERMON DEVOTIONAL STUDY

Ask the Holy Spirit to reveal His truth and wisdom as you go through this lesson.

1. Read Acts chapter 10. Taking into account the last couple of passages studied, how did God prepare Peter to take the gospel to Cornelius? Why was this necessary?

2. What kind of man was Cornelius? What evidence do you see here that Cornelius expected God to work?

"IT IS INTERESTING TO SEE how religious a person can be and still not be saved. Certainly, Cornelius was sincere in his obedience to God's law, his fasting, and his generosity to the Jewish people (compare this to Lk 7:1-10). He was not permitted to offer sacrifices in the temple, so he presented his prayers to God as his sacrifices (Ps 141:1-2). In every way, he was a model of religious respectability-and yet he was not a saved man. The difference between Cornelius and many religious people today is this: He knew that his religious devotion was not sufficient to save him. Many religious people today are satisfied that their character and good works will get them to heaven, and they have no concept either of their own sin or of God's grace. In his prayers, Cornelius was asking God to show him the way of salvation (Acts 11:13-14)."

3. What does the fact that God listened to Cornelius and answered his prayer tell you about the character of God?

4. Salvation is of course a divine work of God's grace. But why do you think He works through humans rather than using angels or some other way to proclaim the gospel?

5. What prejudice or partiality on your part has God revealed to you in this sermon? How will you address those things going forward?

6. What can you use from Peter's message to Cornelius to share the gospel with people you know? How will you make yourself available to God this week to do that?

Being a Christian isn't based on membership in a local church or keeping a set of rules. 3. Understand that Jesus Christ took the penalty for your sin by dying in your place and that He rose again. (Romans 5:8; 2 Corinthians 5:21)

4. Receive the free gift of salvation by trusting in Christ alone as your Savior. (Romans 4:4-5; Ephesians 2:8-9) "For God so loved the world, that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish, but have eternal life." (John 3:16 NASB) You can use this prayer to express your decision to God: "Dear God, I know that I am a sinner. I believe that Jesus Christ died on the cross for me and rose from the dead. I trust in Him alone as the only way to get right with You. Thank You for the forgiveness of sins and the eternal life I now have. Amen."
