

SCRIPTURE MEMORY VERSE: Matthew 24:30

"Then will appear in heaven the sign of the Son of Man, and then all the tribes of the earth will mourn, and they will see the Son of Man coming on the clouds of heaven with power and great glory."

JOURNAL: Matthew 24:29-31

"Throughout history, skeptics have had a field day in relation to prophetic Scripture—poking fun, making jokes, and picking apart prophecies. This perennial pastime of scoffers will be especially prevalent as the world gets closer to the last days. The apostle Peter wrote about this near the end of his second letter: 'Know this first of all, that in the last days mockers will come with their mocking, following after their own lusts, and saying, "Where is the promise of His coming? For ever since the fathers fell asleep, all continues just as it was from the beginning of creation" (2 Pet 3:3-4). It's easy to think like that if you choose to ignore cataclysmic events like the Flood, when God judged the ungodly people of the world back in the days of Noah. Or it's easy to tease those who believe in biblical prophecy if you think the story of God's judgment of Sodom and Gomorrah and the rescue of Lot was just a myth to scare people into believing. But as it happened in the days of Noah and Lot, so it will be in the future when Christ returns. Those who are unprepared will suddenly find themselves overcome by a period of worldwide judgment. 2. Read Matthew 24:29-31. How did Jesus describe His return? How does this description contrast with what went before?

3. The serious and sudden judgments at the return of Christ are not just metaphorical, designed to move people to repentance—they are real and irreversible. We only get one opportunity to believe as long as we're alive: "It is appointed for men to die once and after this comes judgment" (Heb 9:27). What do these verses tell us about delaying decisions, being unprepared and hoping for second chances?

4. Why do you think that Christ didn't make it clear that we should have to wait so long for His return? How would knowing the exact time of His coming affect the work of the kingdom?

5. Changing our eternal destination must take place in this life. The only way to be assured of eternal life is to accept Christ's sacrificial, atoning death for us and His miraculous, bodily resurrection (1 Cor 15:1-5). We are saved by grace alone through faith alone in Christ alone, or we are not saved at all. How does this truth affect your daily life? Who are you praying for in this regard?
