
# The "Can't Miss" Event



### I. The Rapture and the Second Coming are \_\_\_\_\_ events.

"The Rapture" the event when Christ miraculously and physically removes the church from the earth prior to the Tribulation

The Second Coming of Christ as described in Matthew 24	The Rapture of the Church as described through the New Testament
Concludes the Tribulation	Occurs before the Tribulation
Jesus comes to be with His own	The church is taken to be with Jesus
The church returns with Christ to the earth	The church meets Jesus in the air
Visible and noticeable to everyone on earth	Not described as visible to the entire earth
Will happen after Tribulation events	Can happen at any moment

#### II. The Rapture removes Christ's church from the earth so they don't

rapture to be caught up

For the Lord himself will descend from heaven with a cry of command, with the voice of an archangel, and with the sound of the trumpet of God. And the dead in Christ will rise first. Then we who are alive, who are left, will be caught up together with them in the clouds to meet the Lord in the air, and so we will always be with the Lord. 1 Thessalonians 4:16-17

Jesus will suddenly come to take His own to be with Him. (John 14:1-3)

Jesus will suddenly come to transform His own to a glorified body. (1 Cor 15:50-53)

Jesus will suddenly come to save His own from the Tribulation. (Rev 3:10)

## SCRIPTURE MEMORY VERSE: Matthew 24:42

"Therefore, stay awake, for you do not know on what day your Lord is coming."

#### JOURNAL: Matthew 24:36-44

"As the Christian looks forward to relief from the present persecutions and difficulties, the promise is given, "He who is coming will come and will not delay." The reference, no doubt, is to the rapture of the church when every Christian, whether living or dead, will be caught up with the Lord. This will end the conflicts of this life and usher in the peace we can expect to have when we sit in His presence. The fact that life will not go on forever should be an encouragement to Christians who are going through deep trouble.... The rapture is not meant to scare or worry us or cause us to lose sleep. Instead, the rapture is a hope and a finish line. We may suffer in this present world of brokenness and sin, but our Lord will not abandon us. He is coming back to take us away from all this, and we will truly experience the great joy that the word rapture originally intended."
