"As He prepared to die for the sins of the world, Jesus needed to teach the disciples the need of continually dying to themselves of never trusting in themselves. ... They thought their ability to handle temptation and intimidation was greater than it was.... That is a lesson every child of God needs to learn and relearn. But when we are out in the unbelieving world and are separated from the strength of Christian fellowship, we discover how unfounded such self-confidence is."
