DEVOTIONAL & HOME GROUP STUDY

Ask the Holy Spirit to reveal His truth and wisdom as you go through this lesson.

1. Read Acts 19:21–20:1. When have you seen the Way of Jesus disrupt the way of the world around you? How fearful are you of starting that kind of disruption?

2. What protected Paul from the violence of the mob? How does this event demonstrate Paul’s willingness to trust God’s way instead of the way he usually responded to angry crowds?

3. Give some examples of how we try to rely on worldly tactics instead of trusting in God’s way. What is lost when we rely on them?

4. In light of this episode and the one in Corinth (18:12-17), why did both Peter and Paul consider it so important for Christians to carefully obey the civil laws? (See also Romans 13:1-7 and 1 Peter 2:13-17.)

5. Is just as important to obey our civil laws today, as Paul and Peter showed us? What does it look like to do that?

6. What does it mean to walk in a godly way? What are some ways you can more purposefully walk in a godly way every day?

FOR FURTHER STUDY: In his sermon, the pastor discussed how we are to be above reproach—not seeing how close to the “sin line” we can get, but instead staying far away from that line. How do we do that? For more insight read Matthew 10:16 and 1 John 11-12.

A WONDERFUL OFFER

Being a Christian isn’t based on membership in a local church or keeping a set of rules. It involves a personal relationship with Jesus Christ and an understanding of who He is and what He has done to provide man with a way to experience God’s love for us. Here’s how to know Jesus Christ as your personal Savior:

1. Realize that you are sinful and separated from God. (Romans 3:23; Isaiah 53:6)
2. Recognize that the penalty for your sin is death—eternal separation from God and all that is good. (Romans 6:23; Hebrews 9:27)
3. Understand that Jesus Christ took the penalty for your sin by dying in your place and that He rose again. (Romans 5:8; 2 Corinthians 5:21)
4. Receive the free gift of salvation by trusting in Christ alone as your Savior. (Romans 4:4-5; Ephesians 2:8-9)
“For God so loved the world, that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish, but have eternal life.” (John 3:16 NASB) You can use this prayer to express your decision to God:
“Dear God, I know that I am a sinner. I believe that Jesus Christ died on the cross for me and rose from the dead. I trust in Him alone as the only way to get right with You. Thank You for the forgiveness of sins and the eternal life I now have. Amen.”
